Born in Zarcero, Costa Rica, Mr. Rodríguez received a Bachelor (1983) and *Licenciatura* (1985) in Economics from the University of Costa Rica, and a MSc. (1990) and PhD. (1994) in Agricultural Economics from the Pennsylvania State University, USA.

He is currently an Economic Affairs Officer in the Agricultural Development Unit, within the Division of Production, Productivity and Management, at the UN Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), in Santiago, Chile. Before moving to ECLAC he was a Rural Development Specialist at the Inter American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture, San José, Costa Rica (2002-2007) and Advisor for the Minister of Planning and Economic Policy in Costa Rica (1994-1998).

He also was consultant and project manager in Honduras for Eurolatina / Arcadis Euroconsult (1999-2002) and short-term consultant for the World Bank, Honduras (1998); UNESCO, El Salvador & Honduras (1999); RUTA/World Bank (1999); Asociación de Investigación y Estudios Sociales, Guatemala (1999); UNDP-Costa Rica (1999 & 2001 – 2002); DSD- UNDESA, Bolivia (2001); and Capacity 21 Program, Bolivia (2002).

In his home country he was associated with the University of Costa Rica, between 1983 and 1987 as research assistant (1983-1985) and researcher (1985-1987) at the Institute for Research in Economic Sciences (IICE/UCR); and between 1994 and 2007 part-time with the School of Economics, where he moved from Instructor (1994) to *Catedrático* (2003) and served as Sub-Director (2002-2003).
